There is life during and after Corona and I pray that we will have a great year and that our clubs will strive despite the circumstances as we all continue to build our home, school and communities.



YOUTH OPPURTUNITY FUND (YOF) WHAT'S IT ALL ABOUT?

The Youth Opportunities Fund (YOF) is an endowed fund of the Kiwanis Children's Fund which provides grants to Key Club and Key Club members for scholarships and service opportunities.

YOF grants can help you take action. Look around and identify service that needs to be done in your school, community or the world. Then apply for a grant.

Grant Basics

- YOF grants are only given to Key Clubs and/or individual club members. Grants are not given to divisions or districts.
- Grant amounts between US\$100 to US\$2,000 may be requested.
- Applications must be submitted online by October 15 at 11:59 PM, EST.
- Applications are reviewed by the Key Club board at the November meeting.
- Grant applicants are emailed of outcomes the first week of January.
- A list of grant recipients is posted online the third week of January.
- The club's 2019-2020 dues **must** be paid before YOF grant checks can be issued.
- A YOF Final Grant Report is due at the end of the grant cycle (January 1).

YOF IN JAMAICA

Digicel Foundation Mek a Muckle Micro Grant

The grant offers a maximum of JM\$165K to schools, youth clubs, community groups and organisations. To be eligible for this grant the application must:

- 1. Demonstrate an appropriate management structure to effectively manage the project and show financial viability.
- 2. Commit to utilizing the funds for the purpose it was granted. Any deviation should be approved in writing.
- 3. Commit to acknowledge the contribution of the Foundation in all public materials associated with the funded activities.
- 4. Submit fully completed applications signed by two executive officers and a Justice of the Peace.




